

Battle Stains

STAIN TYPE	REMOVAL PRODUCT	REMOVAL METHOD
URINE	Enzyme action-based cleanser	Get to the stain as quickly as possible. Soak up urine with white paper towels. Apply and let sit for up to 24 hours. Blot dry; don't rub. Seek a professional for stubborn or old stains because they can use higher temperatures with their cleaning systems.
FECES	Enzyme action-based cleanser	Scrape up as much as possible. Blot with a damp cloth prior to applying the enzyme product. Apply and let sit for up to 24 hours. Follow the manufacturer's instructions.
VOMIT	Oxygen action-based cleanser	Vomit can have a higher acidity, leading to staining. Blot as much as possible before treatment, and follow label instructions.
MUD & DIRT	Oxygen action-based cleanser	Brush and scrape as much as you can, then vacuum when dry. Follow the manufacturer's instructions.
BODY OIL	Mild detergent	Use a mild detergent, blotting frequently. Finish off with a rinse.
SLOBBER	General carpet cleaner	Wipe first, then use carpet cleaner as directed. Buy a doggie bib.

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NOTE: ALL INSTRUCTIONS ARE FOR REMOVING STAINS FROM CARPET OR FABRIC.
